## WHIEN TO GALL YOUR GHILD'S TEACHER

It used to be that parents and teachers had set days and times for parent-teacher conferences, and communication outside the conference was rare. A quick conversation or email exchange can solve simple misunderstandings, or make it clear that a longer, more formal conversation is needed. Be sure to call your child's teacher if:

> You notice a change in your child's attitude toward school.

> The reading material being used at school or for homework seems consistently too hard or too easy for your child.

### > The comments on your child's paper are unclear to you.
