81 **a. WVGSA/ SAT School Day update- Mrs. Sammons**

82 Lesia Sammons presented the update and explained that standardized testing insured quality and equity
83 in education. Many purposes of the assessments were cited. There had been strong participation across
84 all grade levels in our county.

86 **b. Summary of Principals' professional learning session May 6- Dr. Runyon**

87 Dr. Sabrina Runyon presented this section. Mike Evans of Edwards Education Services had been working
88 with principals. The ongoing sessions had been beneficial to principals by allowing time to reflect,
89 access what they need to do, and the time & strategies to plan for the future. Those sessions with Mr.
90 Evans had been very beneficial.

94 **c. CTE Update- Mr. Dean**

95 Mark Dean presented the updates. He reported that 116 students qualified as completers in the CTE
96 program. Several students were working to achieve the Governor's Workforce Credentials. Regarding

98 receiving full accreditation. He was able to secure a used Police Cruiser from Berkley county for the Law
99 and Public Safety Course.

102 Mrs. Stewart presented information regarding the Early College Academy. There had been a total of 99
103 ECA students attend Southern this semester. Tug Valley had 71 students attend, and Mingo Central had
104 28 students attended. There were several who earned general studies certificates – associates in arts
105 and in science.
